Here is what happen with CyberDyne and TechForce..

In November of 2009 we had purchase into TechForce and change the Dallas County contract to TechForce. Then in February of 2010 we did the paper work to merge with TechForce moving all CyberDyne customer to TechForce. Then May of 2010 we find out what Vong the owner of TechForce has done with Parkland so in June of 2010 we decided to split up CyberDyne and TechForce. Bob Clines was an outside Consultant for CyberDyne and TechForce.

Below is the story of TechForce and what happen back in 2008. We are no way associated with TechForce. CyberDyne and TechForce are two seperate companies and have no ties.

Fired Parkland workers, contractor charged with bribery

Arrest warrants have been issued for two former employees of [Parkland Memorial Hospital](#) and a [Richardson](#) contractor, who police say took part in a bribery scheme.

The Dallas County Hospital District's police department issued warrants Tuesday for Sharon T. Jennings and John Michael Frier, the ex-employees. They are accused of accepting \$61,815.11 from TechForce Technology, a Richardson company that had a contract to install electronic cables at the county hospital. A hospital spokeswoman declined Wednesday to discuss the case other than to acknowledge that two employees had been fired in March and that criminal charges were expected.

The third suspect, Vong Khaodeuanephe, 43, was identified as the owner, president and chief executive of TechForce. He could not be reached for comment at his office Wednesday.

Jennings and Frier, who share a home in Keller, also could not be reached.

As of late Wednesday, none of the suspects had been arrested, hospital police said. All were accused of bribery, a second-degree felony punishable by two to 20 years in prison and a fine of up to \$10,000.

In 2008, three checks from TechForce were deposited in a checking account belonging to Jennings and Frier, according to an arrest warrant affidavit.

The checks were written to Jennings or to Sharon Tyrrell, the name Jennings used at Parkland. She was identified as Frier's girlfriend in the warrant.

Frier, 39, approached TechForce around March 2008 and asked to become a "blind consultant" for the company, the warrant said. He wanted to be paid to oversee the company's workers as they fulfilled the contract at Parkland, according to the warrant.

At the same time, Frier was being paid \$52,000 a year by Parkland as a "cabling technician II" in the hospital's engineering department, according to a hospital employee roster. He had worked there since 2003.

The warrant noted that, as part of his Parkland job, Frier was responsible for keeping track of the TechForce workers in the hospital.

Respectfully, I would like to clarify the relationship between TechForce Technology and CyberDyne Systems; and TechForce Technology, Tommy Hoang and Robert Clines.

TechForce Technology has completely dissolved its relationship with Tommy Hoang, the former Vice President of Sales. During Tommy's tenure, he never had signature or decision making authority regarding TechForce Technology's operations or commitments.

As you may be aware, our consulting relationship with Robert Clines also ended earlier this year. TechForce Technology paid Mr. Clines to assist us with our efforts to secure several contracts including the TCUC contract and the City of Fort Worth Desktop Support Services contracts. In Mr. Cline's capacity as a consultant, he never had signature or decision making authority, with regards to our corporate operations or commitments.

You may also be aware of the allegations issued against me, by Parkland Hospital. I am happy to inform you that the Dallas County District Attorney's Office has completed its investigation of the above referenced allegations and forwarded their recommendation to the Dallas County Grand Jury. The Grand Jury has completed its review of the allegations and made a "no bill" determination. Please note the attached supporting document.
