

MISCELLANEOUS ORDER NO. 48

The Court has noted that sanctions are sometimes imposed by United States district courts in Texas against inmates confined in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice and that such inmates may be able to avoid the effect of such sanctions when they are transferred to units under the jurisdiction of federal courts in other districts. The Court is of the opinion that each federal district court in Texas should honor the sanctions imposed by another federal court in Texas.

Accordingly, this Court will observe and enforce sanctions imposed by another federal court in Texas involving Texas Department of Criminal Justice inmates who file pleadings in this District, unless the sanctioned inmate establishes a change of circumstances or otherwise demonstrates that enforcing such previously imposed sanctions would be unjust.
