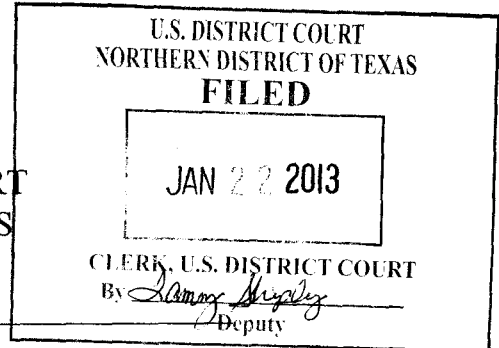





**7.57 LAKE MEREDITH NATIONAL RECREATION AREA**

(a) Off-Road Use. \$100.00

(b) Safety Helmets required for operator and each passenger of a motorcycle in OHV area. \$100.00

(c) Powerless flight. The use of devices designed to carry persons through the air in powerless flight is allowed except in locations designated as closed to this activity.
